1. PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

1.1 BRIEF HISTORY OF THE DECCAN EDUCATION SOCIETY

The great visionaries namely **Bal Gangadhar Tilak**, the Father of Indian Unrest ; **Principal Gopal Ganesh Agarkar**, the Social Reformist; **Mahadeo Ballal Namjoshi** and **Vishnushastri Chiplunkar**, the great Marathi writer; together founded the **Deccan Education Society** as a surest way of national regeneration on **24th October, 1884**. According to them , 'The salvation of our motherland is to be found in education alone'.

MISSION STATEMENT OF THE FOUNDERS

"We have undertaken this work with firmest conviction and belief that all the agents of human civilization, education is the only one that brings about the material, moral and religious regeneration of fallen countries and rises them up to the level of the most advanced nations by slow and peaceful revolution.

1.2 BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

In order to meet the growing demand of higher education in the Southern Maratha Country and North Karnataka Region, the Deccan Education Society decided to start a College in the year 1919. His Excellency **Lord Willingdon**, the then **Governor of Bombay**, was approached and his support was taken in order to seek the recognition of the scheme from the then British Government. In appreciation of His Excellency Lord Willingdon's interest and timely help, it was decided to name the college after him. The Rulers of Southern Maratha Princely States were approached for financial help, which was sought generously. The Honourable Members of the Society selected the neighbourhood of Sangli and Miraj as suitable site for the College as it lay on the border of Maharashtra and Karnataka. The College was declared open on 22nd June, 1919 and was affiliated to the Bombay University in the beginning. After the establishment of Pune University, the college was affiliated to the Pune University.

Today it is one of the leading institutes of Maharashtra imparting Under-graduate and Post-graduate courses in Arts and Science faculties under the affiliation of Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The college is spread over vast campus equipped with **Rich Library, Modern Laboratories, Spacious Class Rooms, an Auditorium, Gymkhana Complex, Principal's Residence, Boys' and Girls' Hostels with Mess Halls, Teachers' Quarters, Residential Bungalows for Life-Members, Large Play Ground, Botanical Garden, Guest House, Bank Extension Counter etc.**

PART-A

WHAT IS THE PLAN OF ACTION CHALKED OUT BY THE IQAC IN THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR TOWARDS QUALITY ENHANCEMENT AND WHAT IS THE OUTCOME BY THE END OF THE YEAR.

THE INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL has decided to ensure over-all improvement in the activities pertaining to teaching, learning and administration. The IQAC has planned for all round development of students, staff-members, as well as the Institution through various means such as academic, research, cultural, sports and community service activities.

The **ANNUAL PLAN OF ACTION** chalked out by IQAC is as follows -

1) DEVELOPMENT OF INFRASTRUCTURE

1.1 NEW BUILDING FOR APPLIED SCIENCES

The College Authorities have been considering the need of more classrooms and separate laboratories for the Departments of Biotechnology and Computer Science since last year. It has been decided to get the building ready for use by the end of current year.

1.2 CONSTRUCTION OF LADIES HOSTEL BUILDING

The present Ladies Hostel Building is old enough and there is limited scope to provide additional facilities like Parking, Sanitation, Gymnasium, Recreation Hall, Ramps for differently-abled persons, etc. The accommodation capacity is very limited as students from Junior Wing as well as Senior Wing are given admissions in the hostel. In order to meet the demand, the College authorities have decided to construct a New Ladies Hostel Building by approaching UGC.

2) INITIATION OF NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

2.1 M. PHIL. COURSES

Our college, established in 1919, is one of the oldest in the region. Most of our staff members are highly qualified and experienced, who have PG teaching recognition from the University. There is a growing demand for M.Phil. courses from our P.G. students as well as from the surrounding Post-Graduate Teaching Centres. Considering the need, it was felt that a proposal should be sent to Shivaji University to start M.Phil. Courses in the subjects of Marathi, Hindi, English, Economics and Mathematics.

2.2 DEGREE COURSES

B.SC. BIOINFORMATICS -

New horizons are unveiling in the field of Biotechnology. Keeping in view the importance and relevance of the scenario, the college wishes to start a new Degree Course in Bioinformatics.

B.SC. COMPUTER SCIENCE -

The college is already running a Bachelore of Computer Science (B.C.S.) course but the intake capacity is very limited as per the Govt. rules. So in order to give justice to students who aspire to take education in Computer Science, the College authorities have decided to start a new course, as B.Sc. (Computer Science) which will facilitate the needs of the students.

3) SEMINAR ON BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES

College wishes to conduct a seminar on Biological Sciences under the Lead College activity. The aim of the Seminar is to boost the interdisciplinary academic activity. In the Seminar, the concerned departments will arrange lectures of experts and invite students and teachers belonging to other colleges in the vicinity.

4) PROMOTING ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

College wishes to promote academic and co-curricular activities by encouraging teachers to participate in Curriculum Designing and Paper-setting activities. College authorities wish to inspire Teachers to attend various Workshops and Seminars, to adopt Innovative Teaching Techniques. The Research activity will also be encouraged.

OUTCOME OF ACTION PLAN

- 1) The Construction work of a new building for Applied Sciences is nearing completion. College hopes to shift the concerned departments in the new building in the beginning of the next year.
- 2) We are proud to state that, our proposal for the construction of New Ladies Hostel Building has been approved by the University Grants Commission and an allocation of Rupees One Crore has been sanctioned.
- 3) Our proposal to start M.Phil. and new Degree Courses as stated in the Action Plan has been accepted by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur and we are waiting for further sanction of the same from the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Maharashtra.
- 4) Seminar on Biological Sciences was successfully organized on 6th and 7th October, 2006. About 150 students of B.Sc.Part-III Botany, Zoology, Microbiology and Biotechnology from different colleges of Sangli and surrounding areas attended the Seminar alongwith their teachers. The event was a grand success.
- 5) Most of our teachers actively participated in curricular and co-curricular activities organized by University and other Institutes.
